IADVL KARNATAKA AGBM MEETING

Held at CUTICON KN 2023, MANIPAL at 6:00pm on 28th October 2023

MINUTES OF MEETING

Once the quorum was set, the meeting was started at 6 pm. Dr. Prakash Kololgi, President IADVL KN addressed the members and welcomed all.

Secretary report was presented by Dr. Shruthi H N, it was passed by Dr. Manjunath Shenoy and seconded by Dr. Narendra Kamath.

Treasurer report was presented by Dr. Veeresh D, it was passed by Dr. Mahesh C Kumar and seconded by Dr. Saleem A Jamadar.

Dermapen Report was presented by Dr. Kirti Katwe, it was passed by Dr. Narendra Kamath and seconded by Dr. Shashikumar B M.

Academy report was presented by Dr. Smitha Prabhu, it was passed by Dr. Yogendra M and seconded by Dr. Ramesh Bhat.

Clinical Dermatology Review (CDR) journal report was presented by Dr. Raghunatha S, it was passed by Dr. Shashikumar B M and seconded by Dr. Savitha A S.

Charmaratha report was presented by Dr Mohan Shendre. Dr. Raghavendra S Tophakhane opined that Charmaratha has not been effective with the awareness program as intended during the current year. Dr. Saleem A Jamadar opined online social media platforms are better public education modes and are more cost effective. AGBM finally decided to sell the Charmaratha Vehicle and asked EC to discuss the feasibility of the same. The decision was passed by Dr. B S Chandrashekar and seconded by Dr. Smitha Prabhu.

Dr. Prakash Kololgi appealed to all members to cast their votes and to vote for DERMACON 2026 at Bengaluru.

Dr. Shashikumar B M appealed to all members to register for the DVL Welfare Trust.

Dr. Naveen K N proposed to have a one-

day CME/ conference for PGs exclusively on Dermatopathology. It was discussed and decided to dedicate more time for dermatopathology in Dermabasics and Resicuticon rather than having separate CME or conference.

Dr. Venkataram Mysore had sent a proposal requesting to send a representation from IADVL KN regarding the clarification if dermatology clinic doing procedures come under Clinics or Hospitals under the KPME . It was discussed and decided that a committee will be formed where Dr. Venkataram Mysore will be the chairman and convener will be Dr. Jagadish P. This committee will decide the further management.

KALIKE workshop SOP was prepared and presented by Dr. Shruthi H N, it was passed by Dr. B S Chandrashekar and seconded by Dr. Savitha A S.

Dr. Ashwini P K, Convener IADVL KN Academy proposed to form new SIGs under IADVL KN. It was decided that upto 3 SIGs can be started other than those already existing under National IADVL. It was passed by Dr. Manjunath Shenoy and seconded by Dr. Raghunatha R Reddy.

CUTICON KN 2021, Belagavi report was presented by Dr. Sushruth Kamoji with a proposal of having liaison officer/ clerk for CA for auditing purposes. AGBM reminded that every CUTICON organizing team was previously permitted to hire a clerk for the same purpose. AGBM proposed to appoint an accountant for CUTICONS for atleast six months period by the organizing team, it was passed by Dr. B S Chandrashekar and seconded by Dr. Shashikumar B M.

Further it was told to the organizing team that GST must strictly be paid by the respective pharma companies who have sponsored CUTICONS, and the organizing team must provide proper proforma

invoice and follow strict uniform guidelines. It was passed by Dr. Shashikumar B M and seconded by Dr. Raghunatha R Reddy.

Dr. Shashikumar B M proposed to circulate printed copies of CDR journal and to invite sponsorship for the same. AGBM approved but mentioned there should be no conflict of interest. It was passed by Dr. Savitha A S and seconded by Dr. Raghunatha R Reddy.

Dr. Jagadish P proposed to IADVL KN to form an IADVL Task Force Against Quackery (ITAQ) Karnataka committee which will be instrumental in fighting against quackery. IADVL KN Legal Cell was asked to currently take over the proposed role for ITAQ. AGBM opined to educate general public through advertisements in both electronic and print media all over Karnataka. Proposed budget was Rs 10 lakhs towards the same. Dr. Prakash Kololgi suggested Finance Committee should investigate the matter and decide accordingly.

Research grants for Life Members upto Rs 5 lakhs for 10 projects i.e. Rs 50000 per project was proposed by Dr. Prakash Kololgi. Dr. Raghunatha R Reddy clarified that when sponsorship is taken from IADVL KN, one of the criteria for receiving grant should include the investigators' contribution towards IADVL KN.

AGBM opined that Awards committee with an ombudsman appointed by the Awards committee must lay down the criteria for research grants. AGBM also directed to appoint an ombudsman for various awards under IADVL KN Awards committee.

CUTICON KN 2024, Chitradurga report was presented by Dr. Yogendra M. Dr. Raghunatha R Reddy raised concern that many members are having issues with accommodation for conference. Dr. Yogendra M said that accommodation will be arranged in Davanagere hotels and hotels on the Highway. He further informed that buses will be arranged to and from these hotels to the banquet during CUTICON KN 2024.

Election Officer Dr. Shashikumar B M announced that only Kalburgi Dermatology Society had

submitted their nomination to host CUTICON KN 2025, and thereby they are being awarded with the same.

DERMADVANCE 2024 will be hosted by Father Muller Medical College, Mangalore.

DERMABASICS 2024 will be hosted by Vijayanagar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bellary.

RESICUTICON 2024 will be hosted by MVJ Medical College and Research Hospital, Bengaluru.

Dr. Ambresh Badad informed AGBM that as Kalburgi Dermatology Society was hosting CUTICON KN 2025 at Gulbarga, he wished to withdraw from the post of Treasurer, IADVL KN as he will be taking up the role of Organizing Secretary for the conference. Dr. Sujala Sacchidanand Aradhya was elected as Treasurer for the term of 2 years, who was proposed by Dr. Aneesh S and seconded by Dr. Savitha A S.

Dr. Shashikumar B M announced all the newly elected members of IADVL Karnataka Executive Committee 2023-24.

CC members were nominated on the floor of AGBM; Dr. Ambresh Badad, Dr. S M Purushothama, Dr. Kashinath Nayak, Dr. Mohan Shendre and Dr. Aneesh S were proposed and seconded for the posts of five CC members.

The core EC members were called to take up the stage and the new team assumed charge.

Dr. Mitaxari M. Hugar, President presented her roadmap for the next 1 year. Presidential projects Arivu and Margadarshi were highlighted.

With the permission of the chair, Dr. Venkataram Mysore suggested to form an SOP for the roles and contributions of all CC members.

Dr. Prakash Kololgi proposed to initiate a Best Secretary Award, to be named as Dr. Kollegal Manjunath & Dr. D P Jayanth Award, after taking consents from their respective families. This was seconded by Dr. Mitaxari M. Hugar. This award will be given to a Sister Society Secretary each year.

Dr. Mahesh C Kumar, Hon' Secretary delivered the Vote of Thanks, and the AGBM was closed.

MINUTES OF KN EC & CC MEETING

9PM, 13th Feb 2024, Zoom Meeting

MINUTES OF MEETING

Dr. Mahesh Kumar C, Hon' Secretary welcomed all EC members & then read out the agenda for the meeting. He then congratulated all members for the work done till date.

Dr. Mitaxari M. Hugar, President, after getting consent from the respective EC member, distributed the work & responsibilities to the EC members.

Dr. Mukund P & Dr. Preethi Nayak, Joint Secretaries, were directed to be incharge of arranging all further Zoom meetings, to be present to record the meeting & to note down the minutes of each meeting. The MoM is then to be circulated to all EC members.

IADVL Karnataka (KN) website will be taken care of by Dr. Preethi Nayak & Dr. Vishalakshi P. All posters & brochures of IADVL KN activities must be uploaded on the website. Dr. Preethi was also directed to update the details of the current EC & those of all sister societies. Dr. Mahesh with the help of Dr. Varsha Gowda V M, Dr. Shraddha Kololgi & Dr. Monisha K will collect & compile all the activities hosted by the sister societies.

Dr. Sachin S & Dr. Heera Ramesh were asked to monitor Community Dermatology work of IADVL Karnataka & Academy activity Yathartha. They both need to also arrange for the Bus awareness program, for which they will need to coordinate with zonal coordinators and sister society EC. members.

Social media handles of IADVL KN were distributed to an EC member each: Dr. Shraddha will be incharge of Facebook & Dr. Monisha will be incharge of Instagram. The existing Facebook account is not accessible as the login credentials are not available, therefore a new Facebook account must be created. Secretary was asked to recover the old account, & if it is not possible then to initiate the opening of the new account.

President highlighted that PLM to LM conversion, E-voting enrollment & enrollment into the DVL Welfare Trust must be considered a priority, & all EC members should contribute to enroll more IADVL KN members for the same. Dr. Mahesh was asked to contact all HODs of Karnataka medical colleges & request them to remind the postgraduate students to convert from PLM to LM. The final year students can also be reminded for the same during DERMA ADVANCE each year. At the same time, to also remind the first year postgraduates to register for IADVL PLM membership.

Dr. Mohan Shendre & Dr. Aneesh S were asked to take charge of e-voting conversions. Dr. Sujala S Aradhya, Hon' Treasurer, highlighted that when she previously worked as E-voting Coordinator it was identified that many members who are yet to enroll as e-voters, have not updated their contact details & thereby an update of contact details for all such members is required to continue the work on e-voting conversions. Dr. Kashinath & Dr. Tukaram Sori, along with Zonal coordinators, were asked to coordinate updating the contact details of all LM members of IADVL Karnataka.

President informed that IADVL KN played a significant role in helping the DVL Welfare Trust membership cross 1000. It currently stands at 1019 among which 180 members are IADVL KN members. All EC members congratulated the President for this achievement. EC & CC members were encouraged to further take initiative to continue enrolling more LMs into the DVL Welfare Trust.

Secretary then highlighted that CUTICON KN (along with other routine activities of IADVL KN) will be an important event for the current EC & therefore full participation by all EC members is solicited.

President next updated the EC & CC members about the Presidential projects Margadarshi & Arivu.

Margadarshi is an educational initiative where dermatologists can address chemists, druggists & pharmacists about various menaces faced by unmonitored sales of unprescribed topical drugs such as topical steroid misuse & abuse, sale of depigmentation creams as fairness creams, etc. Dr. Shashikiran A R was asked to coordinate this project.

An IADVL KN initiative of the previous year, wherein each LM member was able to generate a poster which displays the member's photo, full name & IADVL LM number, was planned to be continued for this year too. Dr. Dilip Kumar was asked to coordinate this activity along with Alkem Pharmaceuticals.

Arivu is another educational initiative but for school & college students. The idea is to appraise the students about the complications & problems faced by misuse of topical medicines. PowerPoint presentation (ppt) slides will be prepared & shared by IADVL KN Academy, which will then be shared to all sister societies. These ppt slides are to be used when the respective IADVL member would address the students. Dr. Purushotham & Dr. Radhika were asked to coordinate this activity.

Both Vice Presidents, Dr. Vidya T S & Dr. Vinma H Shetty were asked to help coordinate all activities of IADVL KN & to guide the EC & CC members in their respective duties.

Dr. Mahesh Kumar, Hon' Secretary thanked all for attending the meeting & for sharing their thoughts on the various issues discussed & closed the meeting.

IADVL-KN ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES

CUTICON KN



CUTICON KN 2023, was conducted by the Department of Dermatology, Kasturba Medical College, Manipal and Karavali Dermatology Society, and took place at Dr. TMA Pai Halls, KMC, Manipal from October 27th to 29th, 2023.

The pre-conference CME held on 27th October was titled “Multifaceted approach to procedural dermatology” and was attended by 319 delegates. The CME comprehensively covered all aspects of procedural dermatology from basics to injectable aesthetic procedures. It also included a session on demonstration and applied aspects of facial anatomy for botulinum toxin and filler injections utilizing cadaver dissection. The conference was attended by 595 delegates and 81 co-delegates.

The theme of the conference was “Intricacies of Clinical Dermatology”. The two day conference integrated scientific talks by distinguished dermatology faculty from all over the nation. A total of 335 papers were presented, 41 out of which were in award categories. There were 113 free paper presentations and 190 e-posters displayed. The State level IADVL Quiz Finals for postgraduates and undergraduates respectively were also held during the conference.

On the occasion of World Psoriasis Day, Psoriasis Walk was organized to create awareness amongst general public on 29th October.

Overall, it was a well-attended, well-organized event.

DERMABASICS

Dermabasics 2024 was held on 28th January at Vijayanagar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bellari. The program was inaugurated by Dr. Gangadhar Gowda T, Director VIMS Bellary.

The programme was attended by 180 first year residents from all over the state. The program was scheduled from 9am to 5.30pm.

Eminent dermatologists who attended and gave talks included Dr. Mitaxari M Hugar, DR. Raghunatha S, Dr Balachandra Ankad, Dr. Mahesh Kumar, Dr. Suga Reddy, Dr. Yogendra M, Dr. Manjunath Hulmani, Dr. Ravi Rathod and Dr Shivananda D, Dr. Arun C Inmandar.

Various important topics were covered : scope of dermatology and role of residents, approach to a case of leprosy, dermatology and STD, Basics of dermatoscopy, dermatopathology, dermatosurgery, research methodology and approach to synopsis writing, bedside investigations in dermatology. The program was concluded with post session evaluation for post graduates.

Karnataka Medical Council has accredited two credit hours for the program.

CME AND WORKSHOPS CONDUCTED

Dermatopathology CME : A Brief Report

IADVL KN BENEVOLENT FUND

Introduction : “IADVL KN Benevolent Fund” is a novel initiative of IADVL KN for the benefit of its members.

Objectives : The objective for which the fund is established is to provide financial assistance for maintenance, medical illness or any other exceptional circumstances to necessitous members.

This scheme will be helpful to meet immediate expenses in case a member needs ICU care, prolonged medical care, and for permanent disability. IADVL KN aims to provide benevolence in the form of immediate financial assistance to its members to tide over their genuine financial difficulty.

This will also assure members the support and good wishes of the entire IADVL KN family. This scheme will strengthen the bond between the members and IADVL KN association, making our association more member-friendly and purposeful. Hence, the objective of this scheme is to provide financial help to the deserving members.

- 1. Eligibility:** Any bonafide life member (LM) and provisional life members (PLM) of IADVL KN. PLM will be eligible till they are members of IADVL-KN.
- 2. Membership of the Fund:** The existing LM and PLM members of IADVL-KN, will continue to be

the members of the benevolent fund.

- 3. Administration :** The administration of the fund shall vest in a managing committee, which shall carry out the objects of the fund and generally exercise all powers in furtherance Indian Association of Dermatologists, Venereologists & Leprologists Karnataka Branch thereof. The committee shall consist of total 11 members. The following shall be the members of Managing Committee.

Chairman (President of IADVL-KN)

Central finance committee chairman

Members: Honorary General Secretary & Treasurer of IADVL-KN. Other committee members
Ex officio IADVL KN (1 Past President, 1 Past Vice-President, 3 Past Secretary /Treasurer)

Two nominated members

Advisers

Past of presidents of IADVL-KN and IADVL-KT

- 4. Quorum :** The quorum of the meeting shall be 7 members. In the exceptional circumstances, the meeting shall be held physically or virtually at any required time.
- 5. Budget :** A corpus of rupees fifty lakhs shall be earmarked for this fund which will be with IADVL-KN general fund and disbursed as and

when need arises.

6. Sources of Fund:

A) Donations from members: Donation can be made by members to the fund. The donation into the fund is purely based on the individual's willingness to join hands for this great cause.

After collecting donation, the association will acknowledge the member with a certificate of appreciation.

B) Grant from Government

7. Benefit : This scheme will provide a maximum amount of rupees three lakhs per member subject to amount claimed, necessity for hospitalization, treatment received and bills produced on case-to-case basis.

ICU admission of more than 72 hours is required to claim benevolent fund.

Conditions covered under the fund : MI, CVA, paralysis, CRF, major accidents, permanent disabilities, malignancy.

In case of demise of a member due to illness, the amount will be provided to family members.

Decision of managing committee is final.

The benefits will be reviewed from time to time depending upon the number of members making a claim under the proposed scheme.

8. Coverage of Financial assistance : All life members (LM) and provisional life members (PLM) of IADVL-KN, as per the register maintained by Hon. Secretary General of IADVL-KN. Benefits will be given only to a member whoever fulfil the criteria mentioned in point 7.

9. Application Process : The member will apply to Hon. Secretary General, IADVL-KN. Duly filled form and relevant documents should be submitted by the members. But in certain extraordinary situation any IADVL-KN member/dependent can apply on his/her behalf.

List of documents required:

Duly filled application form (copy attached)

Copy of hospitalisation along with discharge summary report (should be produced later)

Copy of PAN Card

Copy of cancelled cheque leaf with name of member pre-printed

Photocopy of medical bills

10. Modalities of disbursement: Upon receipt of the application the Managing Committee duly shall evaluate and approve the same based on the merit of the case. The approved fund can be electronically transferred only in the name of the affected member whose PAN card is verified.

In cases of emergency, the Chairman and one of the two members i.e., Secretary and the Treasurer can grant financial assistance subject to the limits fixed above. Each such grant shall be reported to the managing committee at its subsequent meeting for ratification of such grants.

11. Audit of accounts : All necessary documents and back papers need to be filed by the Treasurer and is subject to audit verification by IADVL-KN Auditor.

12. Statutory/Legal compliances : The amount should be allotted after necessary TDS and TDS certificate filed as per norms. All legal and statutory requirements need to be cleared.

13. Indemnity against Action etc.:

All members of the Managing Committee shall stand absolved from any liability in respect of actions, costs and all other claims made against them for anything done or any action taken by them on behalf of the 'IADVL-KN Benevolent Fund'.

14. Rules

Only LMs and PLMs who are eligible. Dependents and ALM are not eligible.

A maximum of Rs.3,00,000/- is admissible per claim on case-to-case basis.

Member shall disclose about receiving benevolent fund from other associations (IADVL, ACSI, BDS, IMA).

If individual member had claimed some other health insurance its mandatory to disclose. But this scheme is irrespective of benefit claimed under other health schemes.

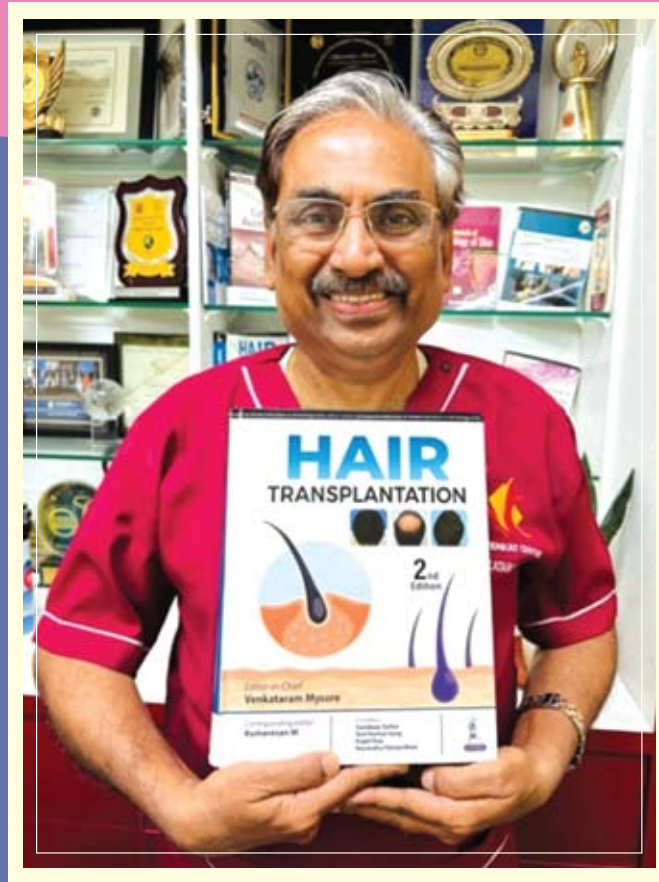
